Applications are reviewed in order of receipt and feedback is provided as quickly as possible. OR feedback is provided by email and is broken down into "technical" and "quality" feedback. Technical feedback relates to NHMRC application rules. Quality relates to general quality (e.g. does the application address the selection criteria; is it readable?) and presentation. This review is different to peer-review (which focuses on the quality of the proposed research).
